



MEDFIELD FOUNDATION 2010 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR NOMINEES

This year, the other following extraordinary people were nominated to be the Medfield Foundation volunteers of the year, all of whom have done remarkable things for Medfield:

- **Andrew D'Angelo**, President of Pop Warner Football, Leader of Pack 133 for 12 years, coached football and baseball teams, ran two Cub Scout dens at once, and over the years has coached/effected well over 650 boys.
- **Diana Mileszko**, chaired Wheelock's Rocky Woods program for last 5 years, ran fundraiser at Dale Street, MCPE treasurer and chaired 4E4 fundraiser, ran Dana Farber fundraiser, and weekly volunteer at Beth Israel Deaconess Hospital - Needham.
- **Helen Dewey and Paul Dewey** - Paul is Director of Destination Imagination, Helen runs SCRIP and provides meals to MHS drama weeks.
- **Alfred Bonfilio, Jr.**, volunteer and coach for youth hockey, Pinewood Derby, BSA, youth sports, and in neighborhood.
- **Eva Potts**, 80 years old and is in charge of beautifying the Medfield Garden Club's nineteen sites four times a year, decorates Town House and Library at holidays, and helps with Medfield Garden Club activities.
- **Kim Agricola and Judy Ambrose**, tireless volunteers for the Medfield Animal Shelter
- **Amber Skerry**, Girl Scout, visited Thomas Upham House and other nursing homes, ran can drives, provided cookies to Tilden Village, volunteered at food pantry, VNA, and camps, cleaned parks, painted faces, and earned President's Award.
- **Emily O'Connell**, volunteered in Mississippi after Katrina, at Medfield and Boston Food Cupboards, for COA, at Tilden Village, nursing homes and shelters, as a tutor, as a CCD

teacher, sits on Girl Scout Court of Honor, and earned Gold Award creating both the Library's first Young Adult Committee which transformed that area and its services and the first Young Adult Book Club.

In 2008 the Medfield Foundation began to formally recognize, by name, exceptional individual volunteers as the Medfield Foundation Volunteer of the Year, and **Henry Marcel** was the first recipient. In 2009 **Gary Wheeler** was the Medfield Foundation Volunteer of the Year, and that year so many nominations of young people were received that a Youth Volunteer of the Year was created, with **Tessa Komine** as the first recipient.

The extraordinary efforts of individual volunteers have made a special marked difference to the quality of life in Medfield, for which the Medfield Foundation honors all our volunteers.
